





Inside the restaurant, there is seating for 40 and if the weather allows it, they also have a terrace. Mother India is a great place to have a party, just ask Lin from British General Stores; we've got pictures from her party on page 24.

If you want, Rajiv, the owner, will gladly arrange a Bollywood theme party for you, complete with Bhangra dancers and he'll even give you a group discount on the food.

So, what about the food? All the dishes you'd expect to see in an Indian restaurant, including vegetarian, are on the menu, but the prices are much lower than most. Elly and myself were tempted by the Bollywood menu (Tandoori chicken, lamb saag, aloo mater, naan, rice, poppadum, chutney and salad for €20.50), but that would have been too much for us to eat. Chicken Tikka Balti (€13.50) sounded tempting, so that's what we went for. It was spiced just right and the chicken melted in your mouth. The basmati rice that came it was really tasty, as were all the bits that came with it; we could tell that everything was freshly made and have no hesitation in recommending Mother India to our friends. If you take a Stun with you, Rajiv will take 15% off the price of your sit-down meal.




## WHAT'S ON


## **ASNA'S SURPRISE**
